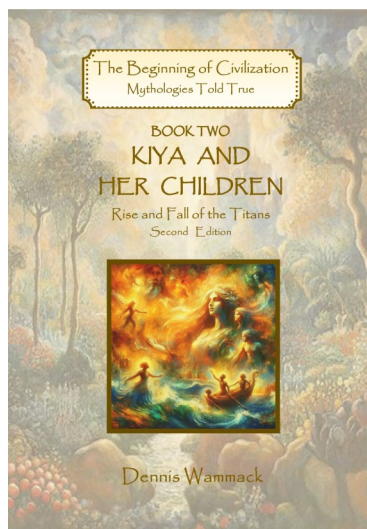
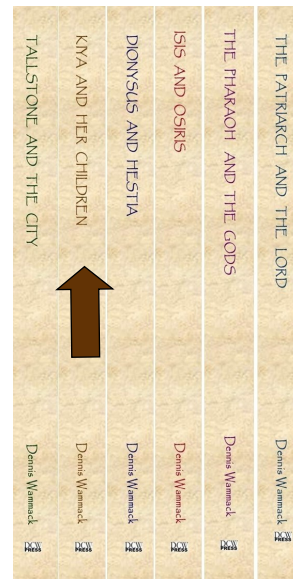


The Beginning of Civilization

KIYA AND HER CHILDREN

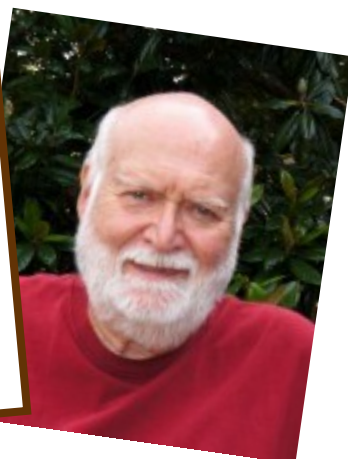
Rise and Fall of the Titans

Kiya and Her Children tells the story of the birth, life, and death of Kiya and her children. Of why Chief Vanam banished them from the Clan of the Serpent to become Titans -- outcasts shunned by all people. Of how they followed the lead of Valki, went their own way, and founded their own little community. Of how the ensuing rage of Vanam led to their establishment of the great kingdom of Tartarus which began civilizing the world — in peace—with goodwill—with the brotherhood of man. Of what went wrong. Of the price they paid.

AUTHOR'S NOTE: The life and death of the Titans are foundational to Greek Mythology. Greek writer, Hesiod, gave a double etymology for "Titan"— from titaino, "to strain" and tisis, "vengeance." He wrote that Ouranos gave them the name Titans "in reproach; for they strained and did a fearful deed, and that vengeance for it would come afterward." My fictional Tartarus is deconstructed from the Greek concept of Atlantis. A case can be made that Atlantis actually existed on a submerged plateau off Cyprus.
